# Community Support

**2007 Celebration** – Promotes the 400 year celebration of Jamestown.

**Governor’s School** – Each locality participating in the Governor’s School supports the facility based on the number of students attending from the respective locality. These funds represent Hanover’s share.

**J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College** – Hanover pays approximately 14% of the College’s operating and capital costs. Other contributors are the Counties of Goochland, Henrico, Louisa, Powhatan, and the City of Richmond.

**Richmond Convention and Visitors Bureau** - The Bureau is designed to promote the metropolitan Richmond area (including Hanover) as an attractive vacation spot, convention place, and motion picture filming location. Specifically for Hanover, this includes promotional inducement with Kings Dominion, familiarization tours of horse racing farms, Scotchtown, battlefields, shuttle service from County hotels to Richmond conventions, radio station advertising highlighting Hanover attractions, and coordinating all feature films, commercial production, and television shooting in Hanover.

**Greater Richmond Convention Center Authority** – The Authority is funded through the lodging tax generated in each participating locality. The amount appropriated totals 100% of this tax in Hanover County.

**Richmond Regional Planning District Commission** – Represents the Counties of Hanover, Charles City, Chesterfield, Goochland, Henrico, New Kent, Powhatan, the Town of Ashland, and the City of Richmond. Funding is based on \$.60 per capita.

**Senior Connections** - A planning and coordination agency for people age sixty and older living in Planning District 15 (includes Hanover) under the jurisdiction of the Older Americans Act of 1965. The agency serves 150 people in the County. The contribution is based upon \$1.05 for every person sixty years of age or older. There are currently 13,093 such residents in Hanover.

**VCU Engineering School** – Hanover completed it’s five year, \$250,000 pledge for the construction of the School. No other funds are recommended for the project.

**American Red Cross** – Provides transportation to approximately 300 individuals in Hanover to medical appointments.

**Arts and Cultural Funding Consortium** – Consolidates and provides funding for the arts and cultural organizations in the Richmond metropolitan area. Many of the arts organizations work in Hanover schools and Hanover citizens constitute over 10% of the Consortium’s member organization’s free and paid performances and programs.

**Capital Area Training Consortium** – Provides job training and employment assistance services to laid-off workers, as well as economically disadvantaged persons.

**Central Virginia Health Planning Agency** – Plans for medical services and facilities, collects and disseminates health care data, and provides health care education.

**Council on Aging** – Provides services for the senior population including a health fair, health screenings, and health counseling.

**Domestic Violence Task Force** – Provides financial counseling and legal services for victims, training programs, prevention programs, and batterers counseling groups.

**Hanover Pre-School and Adult Learning Center** – Assists Hanover residents in their needs to learn, with the challenge of overcoming illiteracy, failure, poverty, and despair.

**Hanover Historic Preservation Fund** – These funds are provided on a matching basis to preserve the historic sites in the County.

**Hanover Tavern Foundation** – The Foundation is renovating the tavern for public use, including daytime use as a learning and teaching center for area children.

**Historic Commission** – Reviews issues regarding the County’s historic sites and structures, including comments on zoning applications which may affect such sites. The Commission also promotes those sites as tourist attractions.

**Irvin Gammon Craig Health Center** - Located at St. Joseph’s Villa, the Center provides healthcare to low income and underserved individuals regardless of their ability to pay.

**Jamestown 4 H Center** – The Center provides camping, environmental education, and leadership training to youth and adult volunteers.

**Leadership Metro Richmond** – The organization works to build leaders for the continued strengthening and management of the metropolitan area.

**Maymont Foundation** – Hanover funds the Foundation along with the Counties of Chesterfield and Henrico, and the City of Richmond. These funds allow Maymont to maintain the present service levels, expand upon the educational programs, and upgrade the park’s maintenance. The Nature Center at Maymont is a state of the art educational center where the ecology of Richmond and the surrounding areas can be understood through innovative programming and teaching techniques.

**Meals on Wheels** – Provides hot meals to homebound residents.

**Read Center** – The Center will work with 25 County residents to improve their literacy skills.

**Regional Taxicab Program** – Implements programs and improves services received by taxicab customers.

**Richmond Sportsbackers** – Promotes sporting events in the Richmond area.

**Ride Finders** – Serves Hanover as the region’s ridesharing agency.

**Science Museum** – The museum focuses on providing educational exhibits focusing on the sciences.

**Scotchtown** – The birthplace of Patrick Henry provides tours and special events for the public.

**St. Joseph’s Villa** – The Villa provides temporary housing and support to families who have lost their homes.

**Virginia Performing Arts Foundation** – Provides administrative oversight for the design and construction of the performing arts facilities being constructed in Richmond.

**Western Hanover Committee for the Aging** – Provides nourishing meals, programs, and companionship for senior citizens in Western Hanover County.

In addition to the organizations funded in the Community Support budget, the County also funds the Greater Richmond Partnership (GRP) in the Economic Development budget and the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC) in the Parks and Recreation budget. GRP is a regional economic development organization promoting the Richmond Metropolitan area. GRP will receive \$390,000 from the County in FY05. The PRAC serves as a liaison between citizens and the County and provides advice in matters affecting facilities, programs, recreational needs of the community, and goals and objectives for the Parks and Recreation Department. The budget contains \$15,000 for PRAC to distribute to local organizations.
